ABOUT YOUR COURSE:

This practical course introduces you to the art of botanical painting in watercolour. You will learn about approaches to accurate observational drawing, together with some of the basic watercolour mixing and application techniques that are employed in botanical painting.

The tutor will demonstrate a few techniques and give simple tips and advice to help you to develop your understanding and skills in this art form. Exercises studying a small botanical specimen taken from the gardens at West Dean will help you apply and practice your skills.

At the end of the day you will leave with a worksheet of notes and exercises together with a simple botanical painting which can be used for future reference. The course aims to give a good idea of what goes into making a botanical painting and a little insight into the content of a longer course at West Dean.

Starting points. For those with little or no experience or for those who want to go back to basics and would like a structured introduction to a subject.
