5D6545 FUSING PHOTOGRAPHY WITH OIL PAINT

Tutor: HEATHER GRAY-NEWTON

Dates: 5 DAYS SUNDAY 30 OCTOBER – FRIDAY 4 NOVEMBER

ABOUT YOUR COURSE:

This exciting mixed media course will teach you the process developed by the artist to fuse photography and oil paint, and to create imaginative paintings. The tutor also presents the concept of fusing photography and oil paints into the context of art history and contemporary art practice.

Structured sessions will take you through the processes step by step, supported by tutor demonstration and instruction. Steps include surface preparation, transferring photographic images and handmade marks, responding to your painting as it takes shape, applying oil paint and progressing to completion. Incorporating Photoshop Elements opens up photo manipulation opportunities, affording digital collaging and overlaying. This flexibility enables more complex compositions along with exciting possibilities for developing new visual language. As the week progresses you begin to visualise and widen your investigations and will be encouraged in self-experimentation and self-expression.

The process of making begins the first evening preparing surfaces. Tutor samples showing results of two ways of working will be presented and discussed. On the first morning you start with the first of these two methods. Each approach uses photography and oil paint. With the first method you make a direct transfer from a photograph. With the second method you digitally manipulate the photograph using Photoshop Elements. The two methods provide choice as to how much digital work you would like to do.

You will learn how to apply hand drawn elements using: pencil, permanent pen, oil pastels and oil paints as well as photographs, onto both board and canvas. In addition, the tutor will give instruction on oil painting techniques that are relevant to this process, which will include colour mixing, thinning with Liquin and application with brushes and a palette knife. As the processes can have unpredictable aspects, you will be challenged to tackle this contemporary mix of mediums in a painterly way, encouraging the development of visualisation skills.

It is essential that you bring your own wonderful photographs to work from! It may also be possible to take photographs from around the beautiful West Dean College grounds (weather permitting). For the second method digitally manipulating imagery, the following processes in Photoshop Elements will be covered:

- Creating a new project page
- Opening a jpg photograph
- Bringing in other photos and creating layers
- Repositioning layers
- Marquee and Wand selection tools
- Erase and Delete
- Scale and Opacity
- Transparency
- Save '.psd' working files and '.jpg' files
- Flatten image
- Flip Image
- Send to print / Fit to page

By the end of the course you will have created between 2 and 4 pieces of finished work, and had opportunity to work on hand made paper. You will have developed visualisation abilities, and gained confidence with using oil paints and colour mixing along with collaging different imagery into exciting compositions. You will also have knowledge of mixing the different mediums onto at least two different surfaces.

LEVEL: INTERMEDIATE

Skills development. For those who have taken a related course or have some existing skills. The focus is on further developing and building of skills working towards independent practice.

Is there anything a potential student needs to be able to do to succeed on this course?

Basic computer skills are essential for this course.

Experience with Photoshop or Photoshop Elements will be an advantage.

ABOUT YOUR TUTOR:

Heather Gray-Newton graduated from West Dean College with an MA in 2006. Heather creates expressive figurative and landscape work. She is a member of the contemporary art group 'ARTEL'. Heather has had work accepted into the National Open Art Competition, 2010 and short listed in 2014, as well as winning the Stride Open at the Oxmarket, Chichester in 2010.
