

## SHORT COURSE DETAILS

LW6560 PAPER SCULPTURES - STORY BOOK GARMENTS

Tutor: JENNIFER COLLIER

Dates: LONG WEEKEND FRIDAY 4 NOVEMBER – MONDAY 7 NOVEMBER

## **ABOUT YOUR COURSE:**

Create surfaces, by waxing, trapping, layering and embedding into plastics, papers and fabrics, and then go on to embellish these using a wide range of hand and machine techniques. We will use these to create small garments using templates I have devised, and then go on to designing and making larger garments of your own design using the techniques and skills learnt in this course.

## Day One AM:

- Portfolio talk.
- Demonstration of 'experimental techniques' including waxing tea bags, trapping with plastics, fusing plastics, transferring magazine images using sellotape and waxing papers.
- Participants to experiment with each of these techniques.

# Day One PM:

Creating garments using the techniques from the morning session in conjunction with my garment templates, which include gloves, dicky bows, ties, bibs and dresses. This will allow you to see what works best and think how these ideas can be pushed forward in your own designs on day three.

## Day Two:

Creating paper 'fabrics'. I will show a range of traditional hand techniques, including Cross Stitch, Running Stitch, Loopy Stitching, Satin Stitch, Suffolk Puffs and Covered Buttons. I will also show machine techniques including Paper Patchwork, Cathedral Squares, Pleating, Paper Pockets, Button Loops, Bound Buttonholes, Covered Binding and Finished Edges (such as buckle loops). You will be encouraged to try every technique shown, and create paper samplers, that will inform your decisions on day three.

## Day Three:

Working on own garment projects, using the skills and techniques learnt in the first two days of the course. I will help you to design your own templates for these larger garments. This garment will hopefully use the book you have brought along, and capture ideas from within the text.

#### **LEVEL: SUITABLE FOR ALL**

A subject focused course that is delivered to suit any level of experience from beginner to advanced practitioner. A structured start is followed by guided independent practice.

## **ABOUT YOUR TUTOR:**

Jennifer Collier has led the way in the upcycling revolution in art and craft; a veteran maker of vintage material, investigating the re-used and recycled since 1999. "Giving new life to things that would otherwise go unloved or be thrown away," is central to her practice.

Welcome to her fantastical world, where every exquisite detail is made, folded and manipulated from paper. Once books, maps, envelopes, wallpaper or scrap, the paper is transformed into textural forms. Like cloth it is stitched to construct two or three dimensional objects. The main technique employed is stitch; a contemporary twist on traditional textiles. The papers themselves serve as both the inspiration and the media for the work, with the narrative of the books and papers suggesting the forms, so a retro camera from vintage photos, or a sewing machine from vintage dress making patterns. To accentuate the fact the work is all stitched she incorporates many different embroidery techniques into the work, such as the covered binding, button loops, covered buttons, Cathedral Squares, Bullion Roses, pleating and patchwork to transform a pile of beautiful papers into something truly unique....

Jennifer completed a BA (Hons) in Textiles (Print, Knit & Weave) in 1999 at Manchester Metropolitan University, and has since evolved into paper, with all of the techniques she now uses being self-taught in her 15 years in business. Her work has been featured in many magazine including Vogue, Elle Decoration, Living etc, Times, Red, Eve, Marie Claire, Crafts, Embroidery, Country Living, Telegraph and Selvedge.
