WE6639 WOODTURNING – BOWLS WITH TEXTURE

Tutor: COLIN SIMPSON

Dates: WEEKEND FRIDAY 9 DECEMBER – SUNDAY 11 DECEMBER

ABOUT YOUR COURSE:

This course will focus on developing skills for woodturning bowls and give you hands-on practical experience of various texturing techniques.

The versatility of the bowl gouge will be covered, together with sharpening techniques, the way wood likes to be cut, and the application of various texturing and colouring techniques. There will also be a discussion on good bowl design. If you have previous woodturning experience and have a particular project in mind, the tutor will be happy to accommodate it, providing time allows.

You will have exclusive use of a lathe and its accessories for the duration of the course, and work at your own pace. However, the tutor will demonstrate and explain techniques both formally and informally to the group and on an individual basis.

LEVEL: BEGINNERS/INTERMEDIATE

For those with little or no experience and for those who have taken a related course. Suited to those who would like a structured introduction to a subject, with further building of skills to work towards independent practise.

ABOUT YOUR TUTOR:

Colin Simpson is a professional woodturner and regularly writes articles on the subject for various woodworking magazines. His turned bowls have often been sold in The National Trust's shops and at our own Garden shop.

Sanding sealer, if you have any

Suitable clothing: overall or smock, plus sturdy covered shoes are essential
