3D6798 MAKING AN IMPRESSION WITH MONOPRINT – THE PAINTERLY

ABOUT YOUR COURSE:

Monoprinting is the process of transferring marks from one surface to another, pressing paint or printing ink from a print plate surface onto paper, to create exciting marks and images.

Monoprinting transforms your painted or drawn or roller made marks in so many ways, some very exciting and unpredictable, others more controlled. We will work through as many exercises as possible in the time available to give you confidence and insight into what can be achieved and how that may relate to your ongoing creative work.

Using both water based and oil based printing inks, we will playfully explore the different characteristics they offer us. Learn how to recreate your own sketches or photographic material, combining them with the delightfully endless possible range of marks and effects. You can make the most exquisite fine lines but also apply thick and textured paint, and everything in between. We will make mono prints directly from our subject whether it be the gardens at West Dean, weather permitting, or from your personal subject choices or still life.

The mono prints we create might be finished compositions or can lead you towards some new and exciting ways of starting or making paintings, but everything we will do can be applied to painting with different media. This course aims not only to encourage you to try a variety of mark making methods, but to broaden your skills with drawing and painting.

We will take a look at some works by Paul Klee, Tracy Emin and Degas – to see different uses of monoprint or transferred marks.

LEVEL: BEGINNERS

Starting points. For those with little or no experience who want to go back to basics and would like a structured introduction to a subject.

Is there anything a potential student needs to be able to do to succeed on this course?

It is always helpful to bring sketch books and images that are personal to work from and for inspiration. We will be able to discuss them and work out the best way of translating or recreating different images. It is not necessary for you to bring anything except a willingness to try.

ABOUT YOUR TUTOR:

Susie Hunt is experimental, an innovative artist and inspiring art tutor. She uses predominantly water based media with traditional and modern application. Her subject is mainly taken from the landscape that she walks through with her dogs. But more recently she has been working with images evoked by memory of family and people in the past.

In recent years she has shown works at Aberdeen Artists Annual Exhibition, The Royal Academy Summer Exhibition, The Royal Scottish Water-colourists Exhibition, and The Royal Scottish Academy Exhibition, Edinburgh and the Royal Institute of Painters in Watercolour, London.
