4D6769 MODELLING FROM LIFE IN PLASTER

Tutor: JOHN BLAKELEY

Dates: 4 DAYS MONDAY 27 FEBRUARY – FRIDAY 3 MARCH

#### **ABOUT YOUR COURSE:**

Experience the unique immediacy of working direct in plaster, with a variety of different processes, building a basic armature, adding on and carving away plaster.

You will have the opportunity to work for a day from a life-model, deciding on a chosen pose, then with the use of sketches, quick clay maquettes, notes etc, you learn to translate source materials to then produce a plaster sculpture. There will be individual tuition and guidance throughout the course.

During the course you will discover the important role drawing and gathering information have in relationship to producing a life-study. You will also learn techniques including building an armature specifically for plasterwork that can be adapted during the development of a piece; combining plaster with other materials; using tools or hands to apply the plaster.

On the last day the tutor will demonstrate finishing techniques which you can carry out at a later stage once the plaster has fully dried.

#### **LEVEL: SUITABLE FOR ALL**

A subject focused course that is delivered to suit any level of experience from beginner to advanced practitioner. A structured start is followed by guided independent practice.

John Blakeley is a classically trained sculptor and has worked in the film industry for 25 years, alongside private and public commissions, including work for Madame Tussauds.
