5D6569 MUSICAL INSTRUMENT MAKING – STARTING OR FINISHING

INSTRUMENTS – GUITARS

Tutor: PETER BARTON

Dates: 5 DAYS TUESDAY 8 NOVEMBER – SUNDAY 13 NOVEMBER

ABOUT YOUR COURSE:

This course is supplementary to the nine day Musical Instrument Making course. It allows students time to design and make the moulds and jigs necessary for making their chosen instrument. Also to select and prepare some of the woods required. It may also be used to finish and set up instruments made on a previous course.

What students should achieve:

(I) Starting a guitar or ukulele

An understanding of the process of making their chosen instrument.

The correct use and sharpening of hand tools.

The preparation of templates, moulds and work-boards.

The selection and preparation of suitable tonewoods.

(2) Finishing your instrument

An understanding of different types of finishes and their application.

Preparation and application of a French polish or oil finish to your instrument.

Fitting machine-heads.

Cutting and fitting a bone nut and saddle.

Setting up strings.

This is generally on a one-to-one basis catering for the student's individual needs and dictated by ability, previous experience and knowledge. There will be group demonstrations where appropriate. As the course takes place in the main workshop, adjacent to the other courses in this series, you also gain knowledge by interaction with fellow students and other tutors. Those starting certain instruments have information packs provided by the tutors. Health and safety is dealt with as an integral part of the course.

Please note: HUMIDITY LEVELS in the workshop are variable to dry, whilst the College has addressed this, as some factors are beyond our control, instruments are brought at your own risk.

LEVEL: SUITABLE FOR ALL

A subject focused course that is delivered to suit any level of experience from beginner to advanced practitioner. A structured start is followed by guided independent practice.

ABOUT YOUR TUTOR:

Peter Barton studied stringed instrument making on West Dean's full-time Making Stringed Instruments Diploma programme. In 1986 he set up his own workshop as a professional luthier, making classical and acoustic guitars.

MATERIALS FOR YOUR COURSE:

If you are making a new instrument a basic charge for materials, timber and drawings, if supplied, should be paid to the tutor at the start of the course.

A guide price for good quality tonewoods for instruments are:

Tools

Some woodworking tools are provided by the College including a variety of planes, chisels, drills etc. however numbers are limited, so you should ideally bring your own, if you have them, to include the following:

(I) Useful tools for making templates, jigs and moulds

300 or 150mm steel rule

Pencil

Engineers square

Scalpel or marking knife

Block plane

G clamps

Half round file and rasp

Glue brush

ALL PERSONAL TOOLS SHOULD BE CLEARLY MARKED WITH YOUR NAME.

(2) Finishing materials

Bench cloth

Cotton rags

Fine flat files

Nut files

Any tools you need to continue with basic construction (if in any doubt, please ask the tutor – mark tools with your name)

Appropriate workshop clothes and stout shoes (not sandals)

The tutor instructs students in health and safety issues relevant to this course. Students may work unsupervised on agreed projects once they have satisfied the tutor as to their competence. There may be restrictions on the equipment available to students in the tutor's absence. All Personal Protection Equipment, apart from footwear, is provided by the College.
