LW6621 MAKE SIMPLE FURNITURE – FOR COMPLETE BEGINNERS

### ABOUT YOUR COURSE:

If you would like to make simple furniture but have no previous woodworking experience, this course will help you to learn some fundamental woodworking techniques using tools provided by the College as you make a small bench.

You will be introduced to the use of hand planes, chisels, and other essential tools required to make the bench, which the tutor has designed so that you can learn, step-by-step, all the necessary construction processes.

Enjoy a combination of tutor led demonstrations and practical work, as you gain an understanding of how to use the tools you have been introduced to, and the techniques needed to make the bench.

### LEVEL: BEGINNERS

Starting points. For those with little or no experience who want to go back to basics and would like a structured introduction to a subject.

Tom Kealy studied at Parnham College. He makes commissioned furniture to his own designs and for other eminent designers, as well as teaching in the UK and USA.
