ABOUT YOUR COURSE:

To go fast, go alone. To go far, go together.

Gain the tools and experience to work in collaboration from a variety of starting points. You will start by looking at examples of collaborations. As a group you will be encouraged to define what collaboration can be, ways to identify common purpose and make joint decisions for the conceptual development and making of new and challenging artwork. You will be looking at the process as well as the outcomes of your collaboration.

Learn how to set up your working methods, to develop your ideas and set project briefs with your peers. You will be guided through structured exercises, discussions and practical experiments. The work you will undertake in your collaboration will be new to you. By working with someone who has different skills and interests you will have an opportunity to celebrate those differences and work with this potential to develop a body of new work.

The course will get you thinking together creatively, trusting each other and making challenging work. You will learn to express your ideas, to listen, to understand, to negotiate and to make together. You will have fun working in an open manner. You will also learn how to document your working process, and how this documentation can be used in the future both within the collaborative partnership and in your own practice.

At the end of the course you will have produced work that came from joint purpose and decision making. You will have experienced the benefits of working in partnership. The work produced will be the result of two people meeting in order to negotiate, make and create together.

LEVEL: ADVANCED

Creative development. For the more experienced who want to expand skills, develop their own practise and are open to working intensively to achieve their maximum potential.

ABOUT YOUR TUTOR:

Caroline Wendling trained at ESAD, Strasbourg, France. She is an experienced printmaking teacher and ran Gainsborough's House Print Workshop for twelve years. Her residencies include Cambridge School of Art, Wysing Arts Centre and Deveron Arts were she created White Wood. She is the recipient of several Arts Council England Grants.
