WE6638 OIL PAINTING FOR BEGINNERS

Tutor: TOM BENJAMIN

Dates: WEEKEND FRIDAY 9 DECEMBER – SUNDAY 11 DECEMBER

ABOUT YOUR COURSE:

This course is for those who may be new to painting, or new to using oil paints, and introduces some of the key techniques and approaches. The emphasis is on making paintings from direct observation. You are encouraged to develop your own responses to the subjects and painting techniques.

During the course the tutor will guide you through the various materials and techniques of oil painting including: colouring the ground; under painting; build-up of the colour and paint structure using opaque paint; how to use media such as linseed oil and glazing. You will also learn about observation and depiction of light effects, texture, spatial effects and form.

By the end of the course you will be able to structure a painting and have greater confidence in your ability to mix colours. You will have begun to develop ways of using the medium to better express your own responses to a subject and will take home a series of exercises and studies as well as at least one finished work.

DAY I Tonal still life – use of paint, observation of tone Still life – under painting first build-up of colour

DAY 2 Still life – development of impasto Introduction to glazing
