WE6656 SELF-PORTRAITS IN MIXED MEDIA

Tutor: GEORGE POPESCO

ABOUT YOUR COURSE:

Self-portraiture has provided artists with their most available and reliable source of research. Experience a visually stimulating course which will fully engage you with the technical organisation of how to work from direct observation to achieve an expressive self-portrait as you develop your drawing skills.

Learn to draw using a mirror, and explore the use of working from photographs as a development tool. George Popesco will teach you how to use tonal chalk drawing and oil colour pastel medium to make a direct response to the structure of the self-image. The combination of both mediums and the quality of their distinct spontaneity of making descriptive marks will be explored to fully achieve the balance of light and shade, colour and form.

You will also learn how to use line and shape to develop the proportional structure with an emphasis on facial anatomy. You will be shown how to achieve a likeness and capture personality in your work. The studio environment is ideally suited for supportive discussion and shared critique.

Your tutor will also discuss the relevance of self-portrait in the historical context to inspire your work, and provide demonstrations and studio exercises to support you. You will start with several preliminary studies which will lead to a finished work.

By the end of the course you will have developed your skills including line, form, colour and composition. You will also have experimented with drawing media and have the tools with which to continue developing your work beyond the course.

LEVEL: BEGINNERS/INTERMEDIATE

For those with little or no experience and for those who have taken a related course. Suited to those who would like a structured introduction to a subject, with further building of skills to work towards independent practice.

ABOUT YOUR TUTOR:

George Popesco studied painting at Farnham School of Art and the Royal Academy Schools. He has exhibited in the National Portrait Gallery, the RA Summer Show and The Hyde Park Gallery.
