3D6645 ACRYLICS FOR BEGINNERS

Tutor: CHRISTINE FORBES

Dates: 3 DAYS SUNDAY II DECEMBER – WEDNESDAY 14 DECEMBER

ABOUT YOUR COURSE:

Christine shows you everything you need to know about how to get started with acrylics using use both still life and images as a creative resource. The course is structured with plenty of demonstrations on acrylic techniques and how to get the best out of your materials. Starting with observational drawing you learn how to handle both paint and brushes. You will experiment with colour mixing and balancing and gain an understanding of composition. An intuitive approach through specific exercises is encouraged.

Your tutor guides you through each stage from drawing work to colour sketches, and these in turn are developed into one or two finished pieces. You will try out some additives that allow the paint to be manipulated imaginatively and discuss the different surfaces you can work on. You start a process 'library', which will be demonstrated and explained by your tutor. These will give you an understanding of how brushes and other implements can be used to skilful effect. In addition to this structured programme there is scope for you to be adventurous and develop your own methods and ideas. There'll be plenty of one-to-one assistance as required.

At the end of this course there is a group review and you'll have enough knowledge and reference material to make an enthusiastic return to this wonderfully playful medium.

GENERAL COURSE OUTLINE:

- Introduction and various approaches.
- Drawing and its relevance.
- Talk on colour mixing, composition and the personal touch.
- Paint and brushwork techniques including 'hard' and 'soft' effects.
- Other mark making devices.
- Demonstrations for all of these.
- Paint additives: different textures from liquid to impasto.
- Developing sketches into paintings.
- One to one support.
- Group review and keeping up the momentum.

LEVEL: BEGINNERS

Starting points. For those with little or no experience who want to go back to basics and would like a structured introduction to a subject.

ABOUT YOUR TUTOR:

Christine Forbes is a Sussex artist with a background in design, acting, fashion and catering. Her practice and teaching are all about drawing (whether wet or dry) and is a meld of East and West. She has taught both gifted and underprivileged students. Her work is held in private collections.
