5D6887 PAINTING BEYOND THE SURFACE – WATER BASED MEDIUM

Tutor: CHRISTINE FORBES

Dates: 5 DAYS SUNDAY 20 NOVEMBER – FRIDAY 25 NOVEMBER

ABOUT YOUR COURSE:

The focus of this course is both practical and dynamic. It introduces you to the vitality and tactile nature of paint and shows you how to open up your thinking, visualise your ideas and work through to some exciting paintings. There is a structured start with plenty of guidance from your tutor who encourages you towards an individual way of working.

An introductory talk on water based media and composition is followed by a series of both observational and playful drawing exercises. We work initially from still life and the landscape, beginning with simple forms.

We find inspiration in the work of selected artists and use their methodologies to develop innovative approaches of our own. Your tutor helps you investigate and progress your initial ideas forward into larger painted sketches. Demonstrations will be given on washes, paint and colour blending and markmaking with brushes and other tools. You'll get absorbed in the tactility of paint as you push its technical boundaries.

Your emphasis now moves from the subject to more creative considerations of coloured shapes on a surface and you're encouraged towards more intuitive decision making. You'll get plenty of advice throughout this course as your work extends into territory beyond the purely visual. There'll also be time to discover additives and how they can help to extend your painting experience.

We finish with a review of work done.

This course will broaden your skill base and offer plenty of practical tips. It will open up new pathways for self-expression and develop your confidence to work on your own and within a supported environment. You will learn to evaluate your own painting experience more objectively and return to it positively after this course.

LEVEL: SUITABLE FOR ALL

A subject focused course that is delivered to suit any level of experience from beginner to advanced practitioner. A structured start is followed by guided independent working.

ABOUT YOUR TUTOR:

Christine Forbes is a Sussex artist with a background in design, acting, fashion and catering. Her practice and teaching are all about drawing (whether wet or dry) and is a meld of East and West. She has taught both gifted and underprivileged students. She teaches locally and in London and is an elected member of the Sussex Watercolour Society.

COURSE TIMELINE:

All working methods will be demonstrated by the tutor and repeated as required.

Course welcome. Talk and outline of the week ahead. We look at our selected artists' work and their various methodologies they use. Some drawing exercises to 'loosen up.'

The course will then include:

Working from observation. Still life, vistas and simple forms. 'Wet' and 'dry' drawing.

Rendering light, shade and shape.

About bold marks, the tactility of paint and poaching ideas!

Using washes, colour and texture.

Developing ideas using a range of painting techniques.

Composition and working on larger working formats.

Group activity.

Incorporating additional thoughts or motifs towards an envisioned goal.

Discussion and troubleshooting.

Evaluation and continuation after the course.

If using watercolours: scarlet lake, gamboge, yellow ochre, alizarin crimson, burnt umber, French ultramarine, Hookers green, white gouache

If using acrylics: As above plus white and black.
