ABOUT YOUR COURSE:

Beginners will be introduced to basic techniques to make small dishes and boxes including raising, planishing, soldering and forging. You will then progress to raised pieces which include the making and fitting of handles, spouts and lids. In box making you will learn how to score, bend and stamp metal, and make flush and spring joints. Please note: if you would like to make items of jewellery you should book onto a 'One day jewellery workshop' (found in the Jewellery category).

LEVEL: SUITABLE FOR ALL

A subject focused course that is delivered to suit any level of experience from beginner to advanced practitioner. A structured start is followed by guided independent practice.
