6D7183: SILVERSMITHING SUMMER SCHOOL

Tutor: JOHN NORGATE

Dates: 6 DAYS TUESDAY 22 AUGUST – MONDAY 28 AUGUST

ABOUT YOUR COURSE:

On this course you will have the opportunity to develop new skills and further develop previously-gained skills. Tuition is given on a one-to-one basis and the techniques covered are: raising and planishing, seamed and raised (symmetrical and asymmetrical), scoring, fabrication, use of the Bonny Doon press; making a joint (hinge), book, flush, sprung and appropriate catches; assembly by soldering rivets or screw threads.

You may wish to experiment with different types of finish and decoration. Although the College has a good range of tools, it may be necessary to make specific tools where your design necessitates.

The tutor is available to discuss, prior to the course, your design, or what you wish to attain from the course and will advise on the sizes of material needed, as this will save valuable time when the course begins and source specialist tools where necessary. Being students with previous experience, it is most probable that you will have some tools of your own and you are encouraged to bring them. Please mark your tools with two colours as very often students have the same colour. West Dean tools are marked with orange.

Working in a workshop environment, you are advised to wear protective clothing and certain processes will need eye protection.

LEVEL: SUITABLE FOR ALL

A subject focused course that is delivered to suit any level of experience from beginner to advanced practitioner. A structured start is followed by guided independent practise.
