ABOUT YOUR COURSE:

Drawing is a core skill whether you paint, draw, illustrate, make or craft. Learn how to create confident drawings by observing the unique elements of your subject, allowing a more personal mark in your work.

The tutor will equip and reacquaint you with the basic cross disciplinary skill of combining ideas and drawing. He will encourage you to value the idiosyncrasy of your own image making so you can make drawings with greater confidence.

Through a series of drawing exercises you will learn how to communicate your ideas. You will also learn to handle perspective with ease either in the studio or in the grounds of West Dean College. You will experiment with different types of mark making. The tutor will demonstrate the building blocks of witty, representational or more expressive drawing, and provide you with one to one demonstrations.

The course will appeal to students across the spectrum of disciplines from ceramics, silversmithing, mixed media, painting, textiles, metalwork, furnishings, all of whom will benefit from brushing up on core skills.

LEVEL: INTERMEDIATE

Skills development. For those who have taken a related course or have some existing skills. The focus is on further developing and building of skills working towards independent practice.

ABOUT YOUR TUTOR:

Paul Thomas is an award-winning political cartoonist and illustrator whose work has appeared in nearly every national newspaper in the past 30 years. Originally studying wood engraving and printmaking at Camberwell School of Art he has recently emerged relatively unscathed from 17 years at the Daily Express. Paul's first book 'An Unreliable History of Tattoos' was published in 2016. He is now working on two sequels. Paul has had two successful exhibitions in the West End. His work regularly appears in Private Eye.
