2D7089 HAND EMBROIDERY - STITCHING WITH VINTAGE STYLE

ABOUT YOUR COURSE:

This course is for anyone interested in hand embroidery but not sure where to start, it is also suitable for those with hand embroidery skills interested in making raised embroideries. Stitches will be taught as mini samplers which can then be made into jewellery, buttons or brooches.

Using the embroideries of the 1930s as inspiration, you will initially be shown a range of basic stitches through to some simple raised stitch techniques for three-dimensional effects. Once you have grasped these you can choose to work on individual projects, combining stitches, with one to one guidance from the tutor.

At the end of the course these can be made up into rings and brooches, which can make unique small gifts and embellishments.

LEVEL: BEGINNERS/INTERMEDIATE

For those with little or no experience and for those who have taken a related course. Suited to those who would like a structured introduction to a subject, with further building of skills to work towards independent practise.

Fleur Oakes is a graduate in Fashion Textiles from Middlesex University. She now runs her own business making bespoke corsetry and textiles using many old embroidery techniques. She sells much of her work via her Etsy shop 'The Glass Pingle'.
