4D7131 APPROACHES TO STITCH-BASED CREATIVE PRACTICE

Tutor: JAMES HUNTING

ABOUT YOUR COURSE:

With the aim of enhancing your individual approach to hand-stitched based textiles, we begin with a session revisiting traditional stitches and rediscovering the rhythm and pace of hand stitch. You will then have a tutorial with James, where the emphasis will be placed on your own creative direction, aspirations and aims. The workshop will continue as you work on an individual project in a supportive environment. James will provide guidance and pointers as required.

You will need to bring a project, an idea and any specific materials you are likely to need to work on your own ideas. The aim is that you leave the course with new directions and a more confident use of stitch within your creative textile work.

LEVEL: INTERMEDIATE/ADVANCED

For those who have taken a related course or have some existing skills, and for more experienced practitioners who want to expand skills. The focus is on working towards independent practise.

It is not essential to have previous stitch/embroidery knowledge, however you do need to have a desire to develop and challenge personal creativity – an open and enquiring mind is vital.

ABOUT YOUR TUTOR:

James Hunting has been working with stitch and cloth since graduating from Goldsmith's College. He is a professional embroiderer, artist and educator who passionately believes that technique alone is not enough to make valid art.
