2D7065 BOTANICAL PAINTING – SUMMER VEGETABLES

Tutor: MARIELLA BALDWIN

Dates: 2 DAYS MONDAY 26 JUNE – WEDNESDAY 28 JUNE

ABOUT YOUR COURSE:

Learn to paint some of summer's characterful vegetables from the West Dean kitchen garden. Using watercolour you will learn to pay close attention to develop accurate observation; to develop your skills in successful colour mixing; and to create a detailed portrait.

The course will begin with the evening session where the tutor will introduce you to a selection of vegetables and some examples of botanical paintings for reference. The Walled Garden will supply a wonderful range of subjects to choose from, bursting with vitality and character. The tutor will also give a short demonstration to familiarise you with materials so you can start work first thing in the morning.

Day I: The first part of the day will focus on observation and getting a good strong drawing

together with watercolour exercises. The rest of the day will be dedicated to painting and techniques, using a step-by-step method to enable you to achieve a good likeness

of the chosen vegetable.

Day 2: The second day will be devoted to painting and the consolidation of the previous

exercises. It is hoped that you will complete a painting by the end of the course but if this is not achievable you should have enough information and techniques with the exercises undertaken and course notes provided to complete your painting in your

own time.

LEVEL: SUITABLE FOR ALL

A subject focused course that is delivered to suit any level of experience from beginner to advanced practitioner. A structured start is followed by guided independent practise.

Mariella Baldwin is a botanical illustrator and an experienced teacher. She exhibits her work in England and the USA. She has work in the Chelsea Physic Garden Archive.

Simple dividers or school compass

Magnifying glass
