### SID07526 MAKE COLOURED GLASS CHRISTMAS DECORATIONS – A TASTER DAY

#### ABOUT YOUR COURSE:

On this course you will make a set of three glass Christmas decorations – an angel, a Christmas tree and a bell. Each decoration measures about 11cm high. If time permits, you can make more decorations although there will be a charge for the extra materials, which should be paid to the tutor by cash/cheque on the day.

You will learn how to cut and prepare the glass, copperfoiling, soldering and finishing the hanging. Each stage will be demonstrated by the tutor and followed by individual tutor support.

#### LEVEL: BEGINNERS

Starting points. For those with little or no experience who want to go back to basics and would like a structured introduction to a subject.

Carole Gray is a designer maker, specialising in decorative and contemporary architectural stained glass. She mainly works to commission, producing windows, doors and other pieces for private and commercial clients.
