ABOUT YOUR COURSE:

A practical one day workshop with help given on an individual basis to develop your designs for making jewellery. The development of ideas through drawing will be encouraged and help then given to realise the idea in three-dimensions. Techniques are demonstrated according to your needs. Beginners will be encouraged to complete a set project of making a simple ring to introduce the basic techniques of working with silver. What a student can achieve on a day workshop will depend on their experience and the complexity of the idea.
