SID07482 PRACTICAL GLAZING DAY

Date: 1 DAY WEDNESDAY 29 NOVEMBER

ABOUT YOUR COURSE:

This is an intense and rewarding day aimed at all those who wish to glaze pieces that have already been biscuit fired.

A glazing day starts at 9.15am and finishes at 5pm. The main aim of the day is the application of glazes to pots or ceramic pieces. Glazing days are only for potters who have made work on previous pottery courses at the College and have work that has been left here for biscuit firing. The day is limited to 8 places.

You will be guided through the most efficient, which are often the easiest, techniques, and the tutor is on hand to support you through one to one tuition.

The following techniques will be taught:

- 1) Choosing the appropriate glaze for the clay and type of firing (electric or reduction gas kiln)
- 2) Waxing the foot rings and lids
- 3) Planning how to glaze a pot or ceramic piece
- 4) Pouring and dipping
- 5) Use of glazing tongs
- 6) Wax resist, and double dipping
- 7) Spraying (where appropriate)
- 8) Touching up finger marks and preparing for firing
- 9) Decorating with colouring oxides, ceramic under and over glaze colours

All glazing materials are provided.

LEVEL: SUITABLE FOR ALL

A subject focused course that is delivered to suit any level of experience from beginner to advanced practitioner. A structured start is followed by guided independent practise.

ABOUT YOUR TUTOR:

Alison Sandeman is a long-standing tutor at West Dean. She makes thrown functional and individual pieces in stoneware, porcelain and Raku, at her well established pottery studio on a farm, near Chichester. She has a special interest in outdoor firing techniques and is currently working with University College London on a research project on ancient making techniques.
