SWE07672 AN INTRODUCTION TO PHOTOSHOP

ABOUT YOUR COURSE:

This course aims to introduce Adobe Photoshop CC and some of its creative features to photography enthusiasts. These will give insights into creating enhancements to your images using many of the software's primary adjustment features, including working with layers, tools and filters. It is ideal if you have little or no knowledge of Photoshop CC. In this step-by-step guide through the basics, you will work at your own pace using a PC installed with Photoshop CC provided by the College in the digital suite.

You will be able to see which image manipulation, enhancement and merging techniques are available using Photoshop CC by exploring and experimenting with your own images using a selection of creative tools and filters, and then moving onto more intermediate processes of adjustment layers, layer masks, and creative filters.

The course starts with processes that show the fundamentals of image enhancements in its basic form including photo re-touching and repair. Demonstrations by the tutor will be followed by individual practice. Develop your knowledge at your own pace from basic to more intermediate and learn to master photo-image techniques using layers, masks, and creative tools with your own digital files to give you the confidence to use Photoshop CC as an everyday tool.

LEVEL: BEGINNERS

Starting points. For those with little or no experience who want to go back to basics and would like a structured introduction to a subject.

It is essential that you are conversant with using a PC computer, and own or have access to Photoshop CC as while instruction will be given on getting to grips with the software, the tutor will not teach basic PC computer skills. If you are aiming to use Photoshop Elements, or Photoshop applications for design (ie. Non photography) – please see one of our alternative courses which cover these specific areas.

ABOUT YOUR TUTOR:

Beytan Erkmen started his career as a professional studio portrait photographer in 1990 and went on to produce images for companies in fashion, hair and beauty (published internationally) and theatre production and performing arts which allowed him to show his creativity and flare. More recent projects have included photography in education, leisure and technology product design.

Beytan studied a Masters Degree in Fine Art Photography and qualified as a Fellow of the Higher Education Academy at University of Creative Arts in Farnham. After more than 25 years, his enthusiasm, passion and dedication for photography, is still as fresh as the day he was given his first camera. Always passionate about his subject, Beytan has always been interested in teaching photography to inspire others. He provides photography tuition for private clients, alongside teaching photography at the University for Creative Arts, Farnham and enjoys sharing his extensive knowledge of both digital and analogue photography.

REQUIRED PREPARATION:

You should prepare and bring your own digital images, either on a memory stick or CD/DVD. Digital camera cards can also be used with the appropriate reader, or by using the computers onboard card reader ports, raw files can be used within Photoshop, but some camera manufactures require additional software, so it is advisable to keep file types as normal Tiff, Jpeg, or Psd files.

It is a good idea to select images of a range of subjects – e.g. landscapes, perspective shots, buildings, people and portraits, close-ups, skies, monuments, still life, These can be good quality images, not just those needing improvement.
