S3D07389 AUTUMN FORAGING – NATURAL DYES, PATCHWORK AND

HAND-STITCH

Dates: 3 DAYS SUNDAY 22 OCTOBER – WEDNESDAY 25 OCTOBER

ABOUT YOUR COURSE:

This course introduces you to the art of natural dyeing and how to source a local and seasonal colour palette. With an emphasis on teaching you how to understand and play with colour, you will use your dyed fabric to construct a piece of textile using hand stitching and patchwork techniques.

The tutor will talk you through how and where to identify and look for sources of natural dyes in your local environment. Using a combination of your own foraged dyestuff from local woodlands and seasonal plants the tutor provides, you will be shown how to set up a dye vat and extract a series of colours that reflect the tones of autumn. As you work you will be encouraged to record your colour results and source of dyes on different fabrics and threads.

With the results from your dye vats you will be shown how to alter colours using an iron mordant to expand your colour palette further and how to finish and process fabric and threads ready for working.

You will be guided through different hand stitches and ways of cutting and pieceing together an abstract textile from an assortment of dyed fabrics.

On completion of this course you will have a good understanding of how to process foraged plants and use them to naturally dye fabric ready to be sewn into textile pieces.

LEVEL: SUITABLE FOR ALL

A subject focused course that is delivered to suit any level of experience from beginner to advanced practitioner. A structured start is followed by guided independent practice.

ABOUT YOUR TUTOR:

Abigail Booth graduated in Fine Art from Chelsea College of Arts in 2013. She now works as an artist making large scale wall based works. Her studio practice Forest + Found was set up with her partner Max Bainbridge in 2014. Her book *The Wild Dyer* is due to be published in October 2017.

You may bring some additional fabric of your own if you choose and would like to incorporate it into your work. Please ensure it is 100% natural fibres and pre-washed on a high temperature. Note: wool will felt if washed hot so handwash in lukewarm water only.
