SLW07626 HAND KNITTING - USING COLOUR, FROM INSPIRATION TO

TECHNIQUE

ABOUT YOUR COURSE:

This course aims to improve your awareness and confidence in working with colour in designing knitted items, and to extend experience of different stitches for different effects. It is suitable for anyone from basic knitters to more advanced.

We will start with a simple exercise to help translate colours seen from source material which inspires you into designs in hand knitting. We will analyse how the colours work together, and how to simplify this range of colours into a design. We all have different colour preferences, and these can be developed individually, the aim being to develop awareness of how colours work together. Beginning by using coloured yarns wound onto card to analyse different proportions and relationships between colours seen, these are then used as a basis for knitting.

Different knitted stitches, some very simple, can be used to mix colours in knitting, even when used in simple stripes, for example garter- and moss-stitch. We will explore these, and slip stitch patterns, then progress to 2- or more-coloured knitting, such as Fairisle and Intarsia techniques, and how knitting in different directions can be used as a design tool.

The first full day is spent on set exercises. These may continue on for the next days to finish with a collection of samples you can develop later, or you can follow your own direction guided by the tutor towards specific designs. If you are an experienced knitter, you will be encouraged to experiment further with technique and ideas. Always aiming for the simplest way of producing an idea, and on improving your knitting technique, you will be encouraged to work at your own pace, concentrating either on trying many ideas or working towards one project.

LEVEL: SUITABLE FOR ALL

A subject focused course that is delivered to suit any level of experience from beginner to advanced practitioner. A structured start is followed by guided independent practice.

Is there anything a potential student needs to be able to do to succeed on this course?

You will need to be able to do basic knitting stitches; cast on and off, knit and purl.

ABOUT YOUR TUTOR:

Alison has been designing and making hand knits with her own dyed yarn for over 30 years, led by a fascination for exploring the technique, structure and materials. She exhibits and teaches in the UK and abroad, and has published four books on knitting.

Begin to look around you at colours: in town – or landscape, pictures, objects, and bring anything you could use as 'source material', for example a postcard or picture, preferably printed, not on a phone. Basic knitting skills are all that is needed.
