ABOUT YOUR COURSE:

In this great introduction to the wonderful world of needle felt sculpture, you will learn how to make a beautiful life-sized (approximately 9-10 cm) needle-felted garden wren. Learn how to make this enchanting song bird by manipulating the pre-dyed merino wool and natural fibres. Acquire the skills of subtle hand-blending of the chosen fibres and colours, and through practice of a variety of needle-felting techniques, create the plumage and delicate detail of this remarkable bird. Learn also how to mount your finished sculpture to achieve a characterful result.

LEVEL: BEGINNERS/INTERMEDIATE

For those with little or no experience and for those who have taken a related course. Suited to those who would like a structured introduction to a subject, with further building of skills to work towards independent practice.
