2D7318 CONTEMPORARY DECORATIVE EMBROIDERY

ABOUT YOUR COURSE:

During this two-day workshop, Harriet will introduce you to the world of contemporary embroidery. Introducing you to needlework techniques including Crewelwork, Canvaswork, Raised Work and Silk Shading, she will teach you the basics, from framing up to transferring a design, before re-creating these skills in a contemporary setting. Experimenting with exotic colour silks, quality threads and quirky shaped beads, you will combine your developed knowledge to create your own embroidered textile art. With access to Harriet's own archive of adornments, stitch samples and finished outcomes, you will be able to see the variety of possibility available with stitch. You will create your own inspiration board, looking at colour relationships, thread samples and fabric swatches, which will inform your work.

LEVEL: SUITABLE FOR ALL

A subject focused course that is delivered to suit any level of experience from beginner to advanced practitioner. A structured start is followed by guided independent practice.

ABOUT YOUR TUTOR:

Embroidery designer Harriet Frances Stiles was awarded the Creative Careers award by The Prince's Trust and works from her London studio. When she is not freelancing for companies including Alexander McQueen, Jasper Conran and Burberry, Harriet is developing her range of bespoke adornments, created using needlework techniques. Harriet runs her own series of creative workshops, teaches part-time for the Royal School of Needlework – her former school – and runs the Sewing and Embroidery short courses at Hereford College of Arts.

MATERIALS FOR YOUR COURSE:

We have a generously stocked craft shop, which opens daily from 8.30am–2pm. For any materials you need to purchase from the shop, we suggest you do so during the first morning of your course, after having discussed with your tutor.

Materials included in the course fee:

The course fee covers access to the tutor's own collections of threads, beads and materials. This will provide students with ample equipment to work with throughout the course. Some materials, i.e. base materials, hoops and scissors to borrow, if you are not able to bring these.
