S2D08019 WATERCOLOUR PAINTING FOR BEGINNERS

Dates: 2 DAYS WEDNESDAY 18 JULY– FRIDAY 20 JULY

ABOUT YOUR COURSE:

On this structured programme learn how to use observational drawing to gather information, and then apply this in your painting. Find out how different papers respond to watercolour and how to use brushes for wet and dry techniques.

Learn the main principles of watercolour painting through a series of exercises and demonstrations and create a colour mixing 'library' for reference. Then generate sketches and develop your own ideas through to a finished painting supported by one to one advice, group reviews and discussion and learn how to use visual editing to improve your work.

Some poetic inspiration will be provided by the tutor. There will also be an illustrated talk on selected artists to show you different working methods.

On completion of this course you will have gained plenty of practical knowledge about watercolour painting and understand how to make the most of the spontaneity of this medium.

Day 1: Demonstrated talks on: drawing from observation (West Dean garden/still life). Wet washes and brush handling. Colour mixing. Students work on above methods.

Day 2: Colour studies/sketches. Developing finished painting/s. Review.

LEVEL: BEGINNERS

Starting points. For those with little or no experience who want to go back to basics and would like a structured introduction to a subject.

ABOUT YOUR TUTOR:

Christine Forbes is a member of the Sussex Watercolour Society. Her practice and teaching are all about drawing (whether wet or dry) and is a meld of East and West. She has taught both gifted and underprivileged students. Her work is held in private collections.
