S3D07827 SHOE MAKING – SANDALS IN DECORATIVE FABRIC

Tutor: HETTY ROSE

Dates: 3 DAYS SUNDAY 29 APRIL – WEDNESDAY 2 MAY

ABOUT YOUR COURSE:

This shoe making course will teach you all the processes you need to create your own pair of simple sandals with or without a heel, in your size, from start to finish, all guided by bespoke shoe maker, Hetty Rose. Hetty's signature recycled vintage Japanese kimono fabrics will be available for you to choose your fabric for your shoes to create something truly unique and completely handmade.

In the first stages of the shoe making include learning to use the pre-made patterns to cut your chosen upper fabric and linings in preparation for closing (stitching) with folding edge techniques. You also prepare insoles (binding and forepart covering).

The next stage of the making will include the closing (stitching) of the upper to the lining and you will be guided through each stage. The tutor will give examples and discuss each stages importance in creating shoes.

After completion the uppers are ready to be moulded into a shoe shape. You begin the lasting process, when completed, you will forepart fill the base and prepare the other components for the next stages.

The final stage in the workshop will include attaching the sole and choosing your heels, from a selection of heights or flat. Other skills covered are heel covering and attaching, then the finishing stages including the sock making inside the shoe and checking over the quality of the shoe to finish.

By the end of the course you will walk away with a new pair of exclusive designer shoes and have gained basic shoe making knowledge. The tutor can provide supplier information so you can continue making at home, if you wish with correct components, tools and materials.





LEVEL: INTERMEDIATE

For those who have taken a related course or have some existing skills. The focus is on further developing and building of skills working towards independent practice.

Basic sewing experience, including use of a sewing machine is essential.

Hetty Rose Samuels graduated from the London College of Fashion in Footwear Design & Development. She runs her own company, teaching and making handmade shoes.
