## ABOUT YOUR COURSE:

The aim of the course is for participants to learn a pointed pen script: copperplate and/or 'modern' pointed pen cursive or to focus on learning basic italics, or experimental italic variations, as appropriate to previous experience. Also to gain or improve competence with calligraphic tools and materials and build-on your understanding of related letterforms.

This course is suitable for all levels, beginners to advanced. Improve your skills and knowledge with tutor-led exercises and projects and plenty of tutor demonstrations both group and individual.

As a resuilt of the course beginners should achieve a sound footing with calligraphic skills from which to move forward with these scripts and onto other scrispt. Those with more experience will gain improvement in the quality of their calligraphy and move on to new territory investigating a range of script variations.

#### LEVEL: SUITABLE FOR ALL

A subject focused course that is delivered to suit any level of experience from beginner to advanced practitioner. A structured start is followed by guided independent practice.
