SWE08080 PASSEMENTERIE – SMALL TASSELS FOR BAGS AND KEY FOBS

Tutor: ANNA CRUTCHLEY

ABOUT YOUR COURSE:

In this course you will learn the traditional techniques for making tassels, but with distinctly contemporary, decorative features which will give your work an individual touch. Working with wooden tassel moulds and fine rayon yarns in a glorious colour range, techniques will include how to cover the tassel mould vertically with yarn, make twisted bullion or plain cut skirts, and decorate the skirts with beads and/or feathers. Techniques for making twisting cord using a special four-hook cordwinding tool will also be explored.

The course is suitable for all abilities from starters up to those who have taken a related course and have exisiting skills. All techniques will be demonstrated and carefully explained. All that is required is an ability to work with fine yarns and on a small scale.

Expect to complete one or two tassels during the course.

LEVEL: SUITABLE FOR ALL

A subject focused course that is delivered to suit any level of experience from beginner to advanced practitioner. A structured start is followed by guided independent practice.

ABOUT YOUR TUTOR:

Anna Crutchley originally trained in woven textiles and makes passementerie (furnishing trimmings) for heritage organisations, interior decorators, soft furnishers, furniture restorers and upholsterers. She produces both traditional and contemporary designs, and is author of a popular book on tassel making.
