Everybody lacks confidence when it comes to making 'Art' – even the famous and celebrated. This course aims to fly in the face of such whimsy and sets out to challenge, overcome and cast aside nervousness and to convert it into fearlessness and self-belief.

Linocut printmaking is a way to create spontaneous images. By exploiting the inherent process-led nature of this activity, you will learn to gain mastery of the direction of picture making and how to 'fix' problems within your work. You will be encouraged to embrace risk taking, work in series and learn how to create a dialogue with your work. The technical aspects of using lino as a printing vehicle and its allied activities of inks, presses and cutting will all be addressed and mastered.

By the end of the course you will leave with a knowledge of utilising lino to generate images but more importantly, with a knowledge of what you want from your creativity and how to engage with it to make confident pictures.

LEVEL: SUITABLE FOR ALL

A subject focused course that is delivered to suit any level of experience from beginner to advanced practitioner. A structured start is followed by guided independent practice.

To get the most from this course, students should bring with them an ability to take risks, be curious, be willing to invest time into the process and have a serious approach to the activity of having fun.

ABOUT YOUR TUTOR:

Dale Devereux Barker has been using lino as a means of expression for thirty five years. He has taken this medium into realms far beyond images on paper, branching out into collaborative book projects, large scale vitreous enamel panels and large scale public artworks. Trained at the Slade School, Dale is a member of the Royal Society of Painter-Printmakers and his work is held in many prestigious collections throughout the world.
