SID08146 GATHERING AND USING DYE PLANTS - A TASTER DAY

#### **ABOUT YOUR COURSE:**

This taster course will cover methods and techniques of using natural colour, exploring the opportunity to use an incredible garden at West Dean containing hundreds of plants – to extend design and colour work. Accentuating that using plant colour on textiles can be simple and straight forward.

After some preparation in the workshop where we will make an indigo vat – we will ramble through West Dean's gardens (we have the gardener's permission) and gather small responsible amounts of plants to make botanical dyes. There will be some guidance in identifying plants used in historic dyes and some students may have knowledge of dye plants, but the plan is to experiment.

Back in the workshop we will prepare dyes from the plants and colour a set of sample pieces. We'll then plan a larger piece for a scarf or bag — using clamping, folding and wrapping and using the indigo vat for overdyeing and to extend the colour range.

During the course you will learn the necessity to sample and record all processes when making botanical colour, as you begin to understand how to make natural colour predictable and repeatable. It will illustrate that very few harmful or environmentally undesirable ingredients are needed for this method of dyeing textiles.

# LEVEL: SUITABLE FOR ALL

A subject focused course that is delivered to suit any level of experience from beginner to advanced practitioner. A structured start is followed by guided independent practice.

### ABOUT YOUR TUTOR:

Penny Walsh trained at Winchester School of Art and the Royal College of Art in textiles and weaving. She now runs a company specialising in natural dyeing and is author of 'Yarn, a textile handbook', and 'Self-sufficiency in Spinning, Weaving and Dyeing' (published by New Holland).
