SWE08116 PORTRAIT PAINTING IN OILS

Tutor: FELICITY GILL

Dates: WEEKEND FRIDAY 7 SEPTEMBER – SUNDAY 9 SEPTEMBER

ABOUT YOUR COURSE:

Explore ways of using the unique, wonderful qualities of oil paint to represent light on skin. Start and progress a portrait with confidence and develop a range of techniques that you can use to achieve a likeness. On this course the tutor helps you progress your personal style in oil painting and improve your techniques.

Felicity demonstrates how to construct an oil painting correctly using 'fat over lean', explains cover glazing, and how to use composition to enhance the sense of the sitter. She will also provide personal tuition throughout as well as learning within the group. You will work from a model and build up one portrait over the weekend.

By the end of the course you will know how to use oil paints correctly, have a better understanding of composition, and have developed further your own style. You will take home sketches and studies, notes and one piece of work.

LEVEL: INTERMEDIATE

Skills development. For those who have taken a related course or have some existing skills. The focus is on further developing and building of skills working towards independent practice.

This course is suitable for students with some experience in drawing. A little experience with oil painting would be useful but is not necessary.

ABOUT YOUR TUTOR:

Based in Kent, Felicity is a figurative artist and portrait painter. She has appeared on BBC's Star Portraits and has painted many prestigious portraits including Boris Johnson and Sir Henry Cecil for The Jockey Club. She exhibits regularly in London.

Providing a model. Some Zest It and Jackson's quick drying medium to try but you will need to buy or bring your own.

Titanium white*

Ultramarine blue
Cerulean blue
Ultramarine violet
Cobalt violet
Cadmium red
Rose madder
Cadmium yellow
Yellow ochre
Burnt umber
Naphthol red (Michael Harding available from Jackson's – very expensive but lovely!)

*highly recommended you get both

Please bring any of the materials listed, if you have them, and in addition:

A4 sheet paper and scissors

Old yellow pages or phone directory for cleaning brushes while painting

2x jam jars with lids

Rags

White Spirit or cheap brush cleaning fluid is not permitted in the studio, it is an enclosed space and safer alternatives are required. The shop sells Zest It and Sansodour if you forget to bring this and Winsor & Newton Liquin which is an alternative quick drying medium to Jackson's.

The tutor instructs students in health and safety issues relevant to this course. There are no health and safety restrictions on access to this studio/teaching space in the absence of the tutor. All Personal Protection Equipment, apart from footwear, is provided by the College.
