ABOUT YOUR COURSE:

Whether you are new to drawing or want to refresh your skills, your tutor guides you step-by-step through the key techniques used to create drawings with improved accuracy and likeness. By understanding the core principles of drawing and applying them fully supported by your tutor you will gain confidence and improve your drawing skills.

As well as developing your general drawing skills Andrew helps you to identify and focus on a specific area of your drawing that you would like to improve.

You will gain first-hand experience of drawing techniques required for the continued development, and improvement of your powers of observation and the accuracy of your drawings.

Working with a range of pencils on paper we investigate methods of observation, composition, measurement, tone and line quality in drawing.

The course includes a series of tutored drawing sessions plus individual exercises that help you get the attention you need to progress your drawing skills. There are short group assessments at key stages throughout the course. We work from still-life arrangements and the natural settings within West Dean College. There is an emphasis on development and practice of technique to help enhance your personal drawing style rather than working towards finished drawings.

LEVEL: BEGINNERS/INTERMEDIATE

For those with little or no experience and for those who have taken a related course. Suited to those who would like a structured introduction to a subject, with further building of skills to work towards independent practice.

Andrew Fitchett is a freelance illustrator, painter and portraitist. His work explores contemporary relationships with nature, drawing on location, then in oils.
