## SWE08267 WOOD ENGRAVING

#### ABOUT YOUR COURSE:

Wood engraving is a relief printing medium executed on the end grain of a closely grained wood. With graver, spitsticker and scorper, white lines are engraved into the blackened surface of the uncut block, bringing light and texture of great richness and variety to the design drawn on it. Wood engraving can express fine detail and a great variety of textures on a small scale.

On this course you will develop a design for an engraving, transfer the image onto an end-grain wood block, engrave and print.

By the end of the course you will have developed your knowledge and understanding of how to transfer a design to an engraving; increased understanding of the qualities of wood used; and know how to print from a woodblock.

You need no previous experience of wood engraving but some experience of drawing is helpful. Please don't buy any tools before the course but if you already have some, bring them with you. We have plenty of tools for students to borrow during the course. Engraving can be continued at home as it does not require much space or elaborate equipment.

#### LEVEL: SUITABLE FOR ALL

A subject focused course that is delivered to suit any level of experience from beginner to advanced practitioner. A structured start is followed by guided independent practise.

#### **ABOUT YOUR TUTOR:**

Harry Brockway trained at Kingston University and The Royal Academy Schools. He has worked as a stone carver and illustrator since 1989 and is a member of The Society of Wood Engravers.

Some newsprint, Zerkal printing paper and tracedown paper shared amongst the group. Students can purchase more as required.

### Additional Charge:

Lemonwood blocks 75mm  $\times$  100mm and sample off-cuts of end grain blocks will be available to purchase. They will cost between £5 – £20 according to type and size.
