SWE08381: EXPERIMENTAL WATERCOLOUR AND MIXED MEDIA PAINTING

Tutor: SUSIE HUNT

ABOUT YOUR COURSE:

Explore the qualities of permanence and impermanence of water-based media combining watercolours with ink, dye and resist to create unusual, subtle and dramatic effects. With curiosity build confidence to develop images as you work from monochrome to colour, learning composition, colour and markmaking.

Watercolour is a delightful, versatile medium and the techniques you will be working with expand its potential and use further. By combining it with other water based media such as acrylic inks, colour dyes, Indian Ink and resist you will mix media and utilise techniques to create unusual, subtle and dramatic effects. In the process of learning these methods you will gain a deeper confidence and understanding in the possibilities of water based media.

The course begins with exercises in monochrome, as you learn the basics of the method using only black and white, moving on to colour later. This will also develop your understanding of the importance of tone and contrast in your painting. You then explore drawing, composition and painting with watercolour – from sketch to well composed image. Supported by tutor demonstrations and one-to-one discussion and reviews you then progress and develop your initial images by combining media. Using the wash on-wash off technique you will explore and exploit the properties of water-soluble non-permanent media when combined with other permanent media for unusual and surprising results.

By the end of the course you will have increased your understanding and knowledge of waterbased media, and been challenged to develop a "can do" attitude. You will have learned the process and potential of watercolours, and gained confidence in combining techniques and media to achieve different results.

LEVEL: INTERMEDIATE

Skills development. For those who have taken a related course or have some existing skills. The focus is on further developing and building of skills working towards independent practice.

ABOUT YOUR TUTOR:

Susie Hunt trained at the University of Creative Arts and Grays School of Art (MFA). She creates images using predominately water-based media with painting and printmaking techniques. Susie teaches from her studio in Scotland, around the UK and abroad, exhibits nationally and is the founder of the award winning annual North East Open Studios (NEOS).
