S3D08405: IMAGE AND TEXT

Dates: 3 DAYS TUESDAY I I DECEMBER – FRIDAY 14 DECEMBER

ABOUT YOUR COURSE:

This is a cross-disciplinary course integrating two different approaches and mediums in which to make new work and develop ideas. Firstly create texts in response to sensory stimuli, the historic house and landscape, using the imagination and other stimuli. You will then develop artworks from these using strategies, games and exercises to identify and connect themes. You will create, expand and evolve new work integrating both the visual and textual language, to make vivid and striking work.

The course begins with a group practical session. You will then consider the connections between text and relevant visual imagery through observation and questioning. Is the text legible and meaningful, or decorative and graphic? Is the text a vehicle to advance and underline personal thoughts, statements, or are the images illustrating the written word? Does the text alone form the image?

You will be working in black and white as well as colour, experimenting with materials, approaches and media; considering scale, surface and texture. Throughout the course you will be supported by the tutor through question, suggestion and through group and individual discussion. The tutor will provide demonstrations as required. He will introduce you to the work of artists who work across visual and textual language including: Cy Twombly, Bob and Roberta Smith, Christopher Wool, Jean-Michel Basquiat, Mira Schendel, Misty Lindsey, Jonathan Meese and Wataru Komachi.

At the end of the course you will have participated in practical creative exercises; gained confidence in making decisions linking text and image, and a greater awareness of your creative process. You will have produced some final considered pieces as well as much back-up work. This will give you the facility to reflect on your creative practice and ideas for future development.

LEVEL: INTERMEDIATE

Skills development. For those who have taken a related course or have some existing skills. The focus is on further developing and building of skills working towards independent practice.

ABOUT YOUR TUTOR:

Painter, printmaker and poet, Gary Goodman has exhibited his work and performed his poetry in many places around the world including Tokyo, Japan; Weimar and Cologne, Germany; Stokmarknes, Norway; Atlanta, USA. He has taught at Universities and Colleges for 30 years including: Brighton University, Southampton University, Northbrook MET, Bucks Chilterns University, Emily Ball at Seawhites, Worthing Museum, Brighton Independent Printmakers and more.
