S3D08585: CREATIVE PHOTOSHOP FOR SURFACE DECORATION AND

DESIGN

Tutor: ALISON MILNER

Dates: 3 DAYS TUESDAY 12 MARCH – FRIDAY 15 MARCH

ABOUT YOUR COURSE:

The focus of this course is on using Photoshop as a design tool for surface decoration. It aims to be of particular interest to interior designers, textile fabric and fashion designers, ceramicist, potters and teachers who want to use transfer decoration, or illustrators, artists or other designers that would like to use Photoshop as part of their creative process.

You will learn to use Adobe Photoshop to create surface decoration and designs using drawings, photographs and scans of textures and found or made objects as a starting point. Through this you will gain foundation skills in Photoshop which will enable you to build up a high level of skill with continued practise. The tutor will show an instinctive and very creative approach to using this software.

This will be taught using set projects (including taking photographs around the college environs and gardens to use as inspiration) and developed through self-motivated projects, with constant help and advice from the tutor. The group will also be encouraged to talk about each other's work.

The Photoshop skills include using layers, using brushes and making brushes, various cutting out methods, colouring a line drawing, filling shapes with texture, making repeat patterns, basic enhancing of photographs, use of Photoshop filters, using type in Photoshop and using the pen tool to make paths. You will also be shown a variety of high quality craft and art with digital decoration and be given information about companies who can translate digital files into applied decoration (e.g. ceramic and glass transfers, printing fabric, laser cutting etc).

OTHER INFORMATION:

This course is suitable for students who have some familiarity with Photoshop and are able to transfer images from their camera to a PC. The course is for up to 8 participants, each will be allocated a PC workstation, other equipment eg scanners, provided will be shared amongst the group.

LEVEL: BEGINNERS/INTERMEDIATE

For those with little or no experience and for those who have taken a related course. Suited to those who would like a structured introduction to a subject, with further building of skills to work towards independent practice.

It is suitable as a follow on course for those who have attended Alison Milner's *Creative use of Photoshop for artists and makers* course as a stand-alone course for those who have some familiarity of Photoshop.

ABOUT YOUR TUTOR:

Alison Milner trained in furniture design at the Royal College of Art. She now designs a range of products in textiles, ceramics, book covers and furniture using photographic and computer manipulated imagery for a range of clients.
