S3D08548: WHITE ENAMELLING - AN IN-DEPTH EXPLORATION

Tutor: JESSICA TURRELL

Dates: 3 DAYS MONDAY 25 FEBRUARY – THURSDAY 28 FEBRUARY

ABOUT YOUR COURSE:

This course will give you the chance to explore a number of experimental enamelling techniques using a variety of white enamels. White enamel has an amazing capacity to change, the heat of the kiln and the interaction with the underlying metal can produce an array of beautiful colours. Working only with white will enable you to really understand how to control the sifting and the firing, allowing you to achieve a more refined and interesting surface.

Working mostly with copper, but with the option to also use silver, we will explore a variety of techniques suitable for both jewellery and small scale three-dimensional work, and for wall based artwork. These will include: sifting, stencilling, sgraffito, under and over firing, surface finishes, working over an altered metal surface, and adhesive mark making. We will use both sifting and industrial enamels applied to copper sheet, wire, mesh and foil.

The class will be taught through a series of demonstrations and one to one instruction. You will be encouraged to experiment and to develop your skills through the production of a series of samples that relate to your personal aesthetic. We will discuss construction and mounting techniques and you will also have the chance to make a simple finished piece.

I will bring a selection of samples which will help you to appreciate what is possible with the techniques covered on the course.

LEVEL: SUITABLE FOR ALL

A subject focused course that is delivered to suit any level of experience from beginner to advanced practitioner. A structured start is followed by guided independent practice.

ABOUT YOUR TUTOR:
